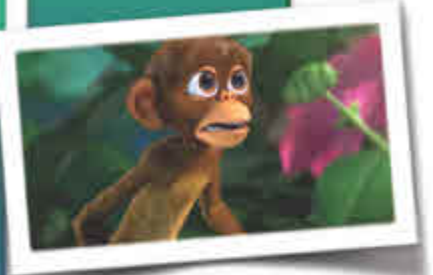

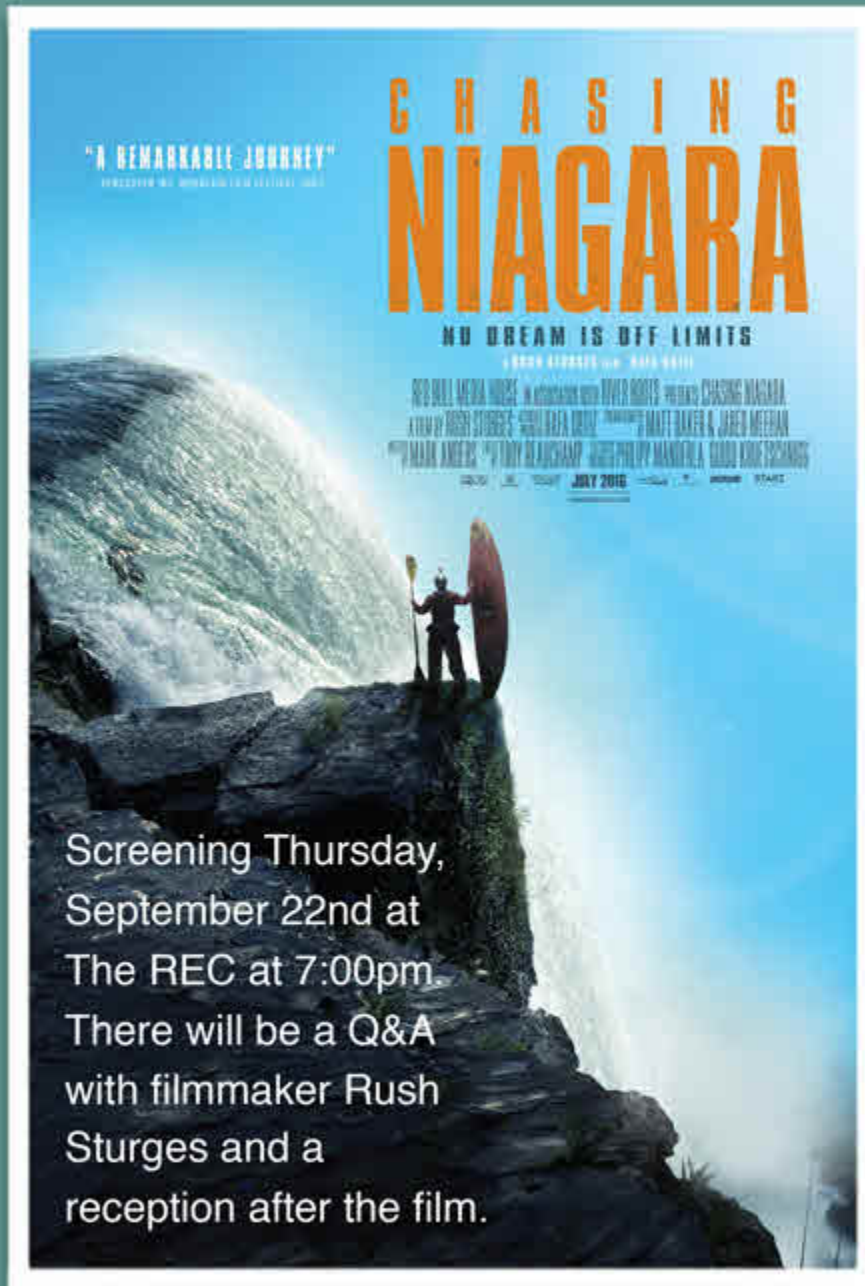

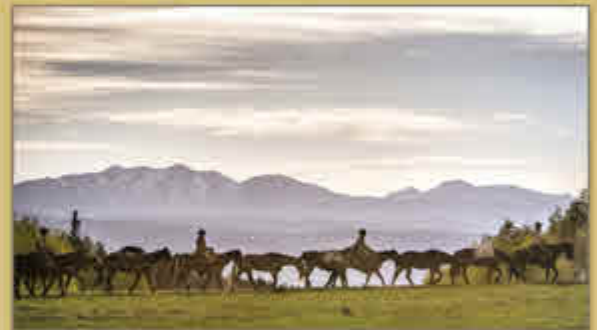

Born and raised in NYC, J.J.'s passion for the theater started by seeing the original "South Pacific" with Mary Martin at age 3. Her theater education included attending all the major Broadway shows from the 50's through 2012. After Attending Denison University, she graduated the first year of Tisch School of the arts at NYC in "Acting". Her Broadway credits include the French maid in "Private Live's" in 1969 and Frances Hunter in "No Sex Please, We're British" in 1973. Off Broadway, Nation Tours, The Wy Shakespeare Festival, The Cleveland Playhouse, The Mark Taper Lab in L.A., SOAP Operas, A T.V. Show called "The Madhouse Brigade", a film "Dead Ringer" with Meat Loaf and "Dream Chaser" with Harold Gould and Jeff Tambor, and over 400 TV ad Radio commercials rounded out her 17 year professional career.

In 1981 she found Siskiyou County while on a trip with her friend. Her first job was directing The Siskiyou Performing Arts Center's 10th anniversary show "Anything Goes" in 1983. She taught "Acting, Directing, and Playwriting" and directed many shows as Adjunct faculty for C.O.S. for 25 years. She and husband Ned headed their company Shasta Starcraft and Co. for 10 years producing, musicals, dramas, and comedies. J.J. has adapted and written music and lyrics for "Christmas Carol", produced 4 times and "The Littlest Angel." J.J. was Artistic Director for The Siskiyou Performing Arts Center for 10 years, and now serves on The Board of Directors. 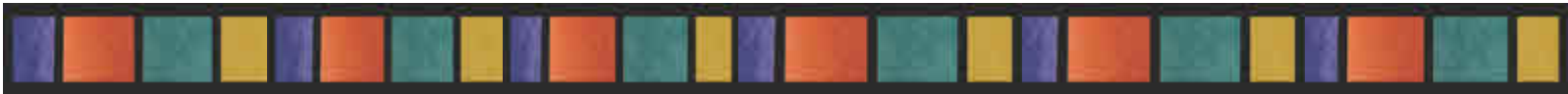

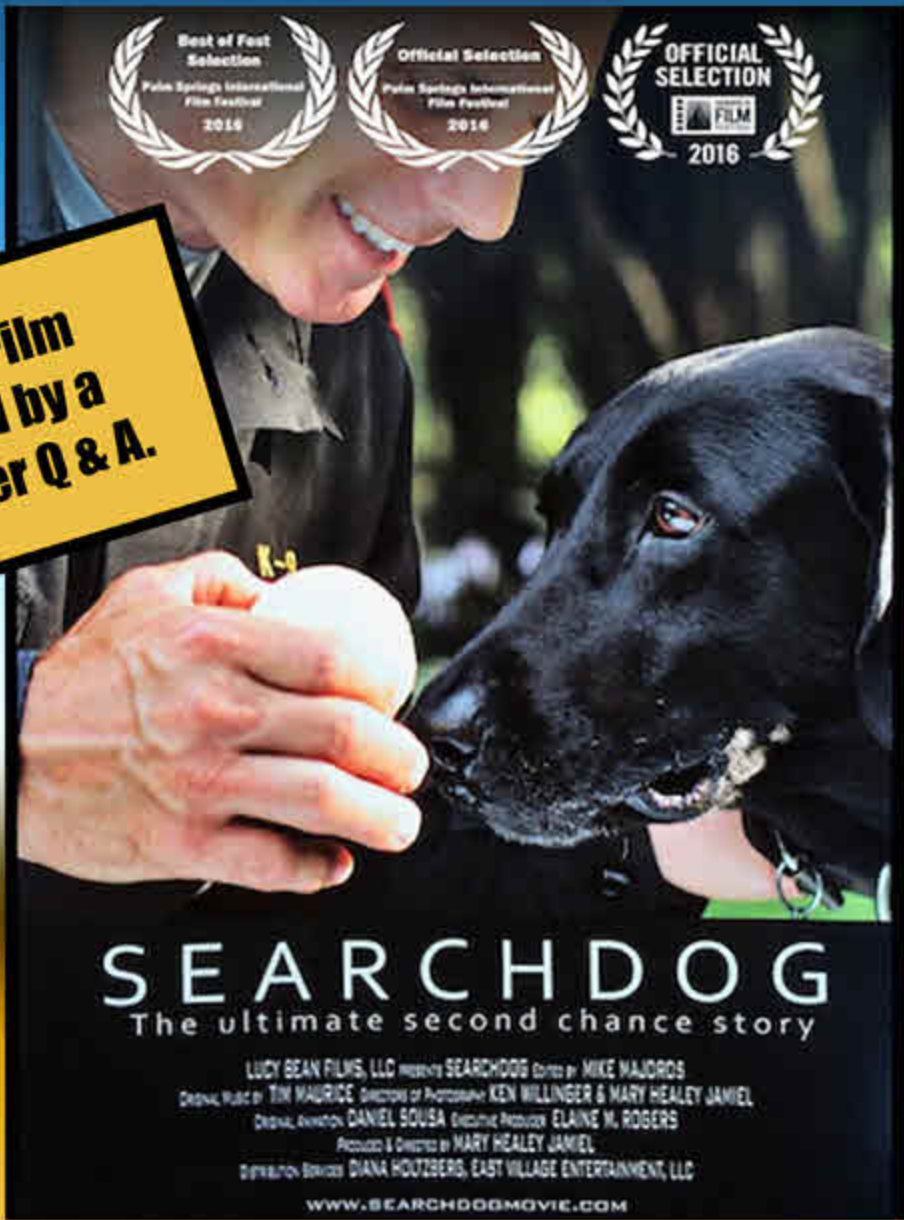
