



The beginning of the new year is the perfect time to make a resolution, to start something new, or to make plans to improve on last year! Wether you want to change something up, try something new or challenge yourself I can recommend event.

The Scott Valley Turkey Trot has been an important tradition for my family for about 7 years now. Not only is it a growing fundraiser for the ASB of both Etna and Ft Jones Elementaries, but it makes me feel better about pie. As the dinner conclude, several guest speakers told stories of their military experiences. Elk member Kevin Sheckels spoke about his recent Afghanistan experiences as an Army soldier. There were many Veterans present from the current war, numerous from Vietnam service, a few from the Korean Conflict, and the oldest admitted Veteran was Elk PER Dwight Roberts from WWII. •






## "All in a Bidet"

So, while standing there gazing stupidly at the carnage of tooth-paste in the sink, on the counter, across the mirror and across my face, I suddenly focused on the toilet. This wasn't going to have a happy ending. But I was there, the toilet bowl was there and I had already destroyed the bathroom so I plopped down. I quickly finished my business and prepared for step two.

Humans are creatures of habit. I have a preferred number of squares I use. I have a preferred way of folding the toilet paper, heck I even have a preferred side I want facing up. No problem so far. Next step is to leisurely roll to my left hip and align the target with the paper in my right hand and finish the graceful dance. Not this time. This time I roll to my right hip and try to get a correct alignment with my left hand. I need to do yoga. I don't stretch this direction, in this manner, ever. My arm is too short, nothing lines up. Sled dog racing has a rich history in California dating back to the early 1960's. Most of the races were held in the northern part of the state, technically in The State of Jefferson region. Truckee, California hosted a race in which the famous Iron Man Johnson participated. He is the man the Disney film Iron Will was loosely based on. Over the years the sport of sled dog racing has disappeared from our area, due to laws passed regulating how many dogs people can have and how we are allowed to house them.

There were numerous races all up and down the Sierras. Today, only one race remains in the state, the Chester Winterfest Sled Dog Race put on by the dog sledding club: Sierra Nevada Dog Drivers (www.sndd.org).

It will be held January 12-13, 2019, in the lovely, quaint town of Chester, California. The race used to attract as many as 40-50 mushers, some of which brought 2-3 teams.

Spectators can have a great time coming to watch the race and are welcome. But please leave your pets at home. It starts early morning around 8 am and usually finishes up around 2-3 pm. After the races, some mushers will hook one dog up to a small sled and let kids (and sometimes adults if they want) ride a short distance to get a thrill!

I personally love this race and have attended it almost every year for the past 10 years or so. It is a rush, as I train for long distance races, but when we run a short 9-13 miles, my dogs cross the finish line and want to keep going. Sometimes, I swear they look at me as if to say, "That's it?"

Washington Federal Bank's grant to the Gilchrist School Backpack Food Program, coupled with generous community support, assures the continued operation of the Gilchrist School Backpack Food Program. The Backpack Program supplies supplemental nutrition to youth who need extra assistance during the school year, specifically on long weekends and holiday breaks. The Gilchrist School Backpack Food Program is sponsored by the Crescent Community Club.

Said Ann Hall, Vice President, Community Relations, for the Washington Federal Foundation, "It is our pleasure to partner with Crescent Community Club to support the Gilchrist School Backpack Program and provide children with non-perishable food when school meals are not available."

Vali Jaeger, Gilchrist School kindergarten teacher and liaison with the Backpack Program, stated, "The Backpack Program is wonderful. It definitely fills a need. This is the time of year when families struggle. The community has been great stepping in with the program. Lots of time, energy and love go into it."

The Backpack Program is very cost effective. The cost per bag ranges from as low as \$1.28 for a 3 day weekend to \$10.46 for an 18 day holiday day break. The longer the weekend or holiday break, the more food items go into each bag. During the 2017-2018 school year the amount spent per child averaged out to \$0.57 per child per day.

The Backpack Program was started during the 2015-2016 school year by Karen Shaw, a volunteer who was participating in the Ford Family Foundation North Klamath County Cohort. The Crescent-Gilchrist Lions Club inherited the program in March of 2016. During the 2016-2107 school year, the Backpack Program was adopted by the Crescent

Community Club.

With each successive year, the Gilchrist School Backpack Program has grown. In the Spring of 2016, during the first months of the program, total of


110 bags were distributed. The Backpack Program increased to 480 bags during the 2016-2017 school year. The total number of bags distributed during the 2017-2018 school year was 600.

Lil Cross and Deb Leslie are the driving force behind the Gilchrist School Backpack Program. Said Deb Leslie regarding the Backpack Program: "The Backpack Program gives a boost to the children who need it." The Backpack Program is an excellent example of a cost effective program that originated at the community level, that is carried out by community members and that effectively responds to an immediate need in the community. •
