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Welcome to our first issue of Jefferson Backroads!








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Discovering The State of Jefferson

Welcome! By Gail L. Jenner

Today's State of Jefferson refers to portions of Southern Oregon and Northern California. Originally this region represented the "second half" or "northern mines" of the famous gold rush of 1849-50, but it never received the kind of historical reference that the Sierra Mother Lode did, even though it contributed as much, if not more, to the coffers of the two states. Moreover, the region was easily overlooked after the gold rush, since it continued to be less populated and more rural than the remainder of the two states.

Because the people who have settled along the northern boundary of California and the southern boundary of Oregon have always been of an independent nature, it seems fitting that this region has attempted, on numerous occasions, to create a new state, not just in name or principle, but in reality as well.

The principle is not a new one, however, but has its roots in the area's history.

In 1852, a bill to create a new state died in committee. On December 19, 1853, THE DAILY ALTA OF CALIFORNIA of &an Francisco suggested that Northern California and &outhern Oregon could both benefit if a "new state" could be created. &ome suggested it be called "Klamath." Others suggested the name "Jackson."

At a meeting held on January 7, 1854, in Jacksonville, Oregon, Lafayette F. Mosher spoke about a state of "Jackson." Unfortunately, as the son-in-law of General Lane, with well-known pro-slavery, anti-Indian beliefs, the proposed state's identity was tainted by prejudice and unfounded fear.

In 1854-55, the State Assembly tried to split California into three states: "Shasta" to the north, "Colorado" in the middle, and "California" to the south.

But the Senate let the bill lapse. In 1877-78, some again pushed for "Shasta" in the north, but the U. S. Congress vetoed the proposal.

By the fall of 1941, most communities in and around the region were behind the idea of secession. In a name contest held by the <u>Siskiyou Daily News</u>, the "State of Jefferson" was officially born. Several Oregon and California counties joined in. See map on Page 6.

In order to garner attention, a protest was staged along Highway 99 near Yreka. Members of Yreka's 20-30 Club stopped cars and passed out a declaration and pledged to secede every Thursday until the State of Jefferson became recognized as a state.

The movement gained momentum and δ tephen Delaplane won the Pulitzer Prize writing about the conditions leading up to Jefferson δ tate's "official" secession. A gubernatorial race was held, complete with a parade and speeches and even a dancing bear, but then, on December 7th, 1941, the bombing of Pearl Harbor took precedence over the region's rebellion.

Even today, the dream lives on for this unrealized, some might even say, mystical State of Jefferson. With majestic Mt. Shasta at its heart, and the Cascades forming its backbone, the region's wild rivers and rugged peaks both isolate and, at times, insulate its residents from the more populated outside world. Panching, mining and logging have been its traditional source of wealth, but now recreation and tourism compete as major industries. But it's the people who reside here that make the greatest contribution to the character of the region.

In this column, I will take you on a visit of some of the region's intriguing sights and fascinating history. Join me.











Saturday May 15: Siskiyou Armed Forces Day at the Siskiyou Golden Fairgrounds. All Veterans and Active Duty Military personnel and their families are invited, as well as the general public. It's a morning to come say "Thank you for your service!" and "Welcome Home!". It's a morning to just come swap stories and meet old friends or make new friends. The event starts @ 0800 with a free breakfast for Veterans. A small charge for civilians. From 0900-1400 is the Resource Fair where a number of organizations who provide services for Veterans will be on display. There will be both VA health care facilities (Redding/White City), Cal-Vet Home Loan, the Vet Center, Horses for Heroes, Human Services, Mental Health, the Family Resource Center, and many others who assist Veterans. 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Backroads Adventures

Does The State of Jefferson have backroads? Does a bear.....ooh yeah, lots of both! Here in my little patch of this paper, I get to indulge myself with exploring and describing these many backroads. I will give you just enough information to head off in the right direction. In the State of Jefferson any direction is the right direction!

What's your pleasure? Road trips? Then jump on your motorcycle, into your convertible, sports car or even the family vehicle and head out. Start in the old mining town of Yreka and head through the Shasta Valley to the base of Mt. Shasta, into the town of Weed, home to College of the Siskiyous. Peruse the shops of the city of Mt. Shasta with a righteous volcano looking down at the top of your head. Discover the lumber town of McCloud or the railroad town of Dunsmuir. To the east are the agricultural communities of Macdoel and Dorris then Tulelake, as you pass along the edge of the Lower Klamath and Tulelake wildlife refuges. Hit the Klamath River Highway down river to Happy Camp then Somes Bar and even Orleans. Come back up the Salmon River through Forks of the Salmon and Sawyers Bar eventually arriving at Etna or South to Callahan. Or come back up across the Scott River Road arriving at Fort Jones. Either way you absorb the beauty of Scott Valley with its ranching community and the Marble Mountains. There are backroads on top of backroads!

Like to raft? For the adrenaline junkie or family you can find white water or calm water to get wet! Float the Upper Klamath, "Slammin' Salmon", and Scott River for a rush. Slow down and enjoy the main Klamath and Upper Sacramento for family fun. Head into the Jefferson Backroads and within a couple hours of Yreka you will find the Rogue, Illinois, Trinity and even the Smith River is within the bounds of The State of Jefferson. Hit em' on your own or check out the local guides ready and willing to give you a thrill!

Want to hunt and fish? The rivers above will provide a fishing adventure. Not to mention the lakes! Everything from world class salmon and steelhead fishing to rainbows, browns, catfish and



perch for the kids. Yup, shut down the computer, turn off the video games, quit networking for a few hours and set the cell phone to "emergency only" then get off your backside and hit the trails. You can walk 100 yards into Kangaroo Lake or for miles in the wilderness areas. We live at the confluence of several deer hunting zones, X Zone, B Zones and C Zones. Those bears, yup most anywhere you hit the woods. Watch where you step! Duck and goose hunter Valhalla can be found at the Shasta Valley, Meiss Lake, Lower Klamath and Tulelake refuges. Hit em' on your own or experience the expertise of local guides who specialize in Jefferson Backroads adventures.

Like to hike or ride horseback? The Pacific Crest Trail passes through the Marble Mountain, Russian and Trinity Alps Wilderness areas! Our snow capped volcano also has a trail or two for the adventurous soul!

Want to golf while in the shadow of a volcano? Think Mt. Shasta Resort, Lake Shastina Golf Resort, McCloud Golf Club, Weed Golf Course and Shasta Valley Golf Club in Montague.



Local Restaurant Review

Delicious Southeast Asian Cuisine Sengthong's Restaurant & Blue Sky Room Dunsmuir, California

One of the most amazing little Mom & Pop restaurants in Siskiyou County is Sengthong's. Together, Sengthong and her husband Don Phelps run a nice little group of food and beverage establishments in the beautiful and historic town of Dunsmuir, California. About 40 minutes south of Yreka and 45 miles north of Redding, Sengthong's is a destination that is sure to delight you.

You will soon find that the menus differ slightly from Sengthong's Restaurant to Sengthong's Blue Sky Room, only a couple doors north on Dunsmuir Avenue.

My most favorite dish from Sengthong's Restaurant is her Seafood Stew. The seafood stew is a delicious and perfectly delicate combination of ginger, cilantro, peppers, onions, in a rich and magical tomato broth. The whole clams, shrimp and chunks of fish swimming through this delectable stew complete the experience. Served with sticky rice, used to soak up and capture the many essences in your large bowl, this dish is the perfect comfort on a crisp cold evening in the mountains!

It is interesting to note that Sengthong and Don have been running Sengthong's Restaurant in Siskiyou County since 1985. They started up in Etna, California where they operated for 15 years before bringing their incredible business to Dunsmuir. Then in 2000, they also opened Sengthong's Blue Sky Room which has been a great little nightclub and eatery featuring amazing live music from all over the world. Yes, right here in Siskiyou County!

The Blue 8ky Room is operating in a very old and historic building from yesteryear. The original name of this establishment was apparently The Flamingo Bar. Lots of history to discover!

Sengthong's fresh Summer Rolls, on the Blue Sky Room menu, are another example of her passionate food creations. I should know how delicious they are as Sengthong got up from our interview to whip one up for me, on the spot! Fantastic! Your choice of chicken or tofu, organic baby greens, sprouts, vermicelli noodles, garlic, red onion, fresh cilantro & mint wrapped in delicate Vietnamese rice paper, served with peanut tamarind dipping sauce. Incredibly delicious - fresh and stimulating.

What is tamarind you ask? Known as Indian date, it's the fruit of a tree grown in Africa, Asia, and India. The large dark brown pods are filled with a tart sticky, stringy pulp containing seeds.

Every meal Sengthong prepares and serves comes straight from her heart. The highest quality ingredients, her disciplined skills and dedication learned from her dear 89 year old mother (still alive and well back in Thailand), and her deep and loving awareness of everything culinary are what you experience when you enjoy dining here. Imagine this: of her family of 6 sisters and 5 brothers, ALL &IX sisters are operating restaurants! That really speaks!

Something new and wonderful that I learned: Sengthong and Don will be opening a brand new breakfast and lunch restaurant in Dunsmuir very soon: McGuire's. Named in honor of Don's mother, McGuire's will specialize in a Good Old Fashioned American meat & potatoes cafe menu. She will feature homemade corned beef hash, sourdough pancakes and biscuits & gravy. Be ready for their grand opening later this Spring.


