Dave and Kim Stillian have a lovely place and also a quality vision for their farm. They sell natural fruits and vegetables, grown on their farm without pesticides and chemical fertilizers. They use composted materials as well as animal manures to build up their soils. These organic methods produce locally grown fruits and veggies that are delicious and healthy - and, best of all, they are available to all of us!

Some of their specialties are red raspberries, 17 varieties of gourmet garlic, many different varieties of onions, and other home-grown vegetables such as herbs, lettuces, chards, green beans, peppers, tomatoes, squashes and cucumbers. They also have 3 breeds of chickens: Rhode Island Reds, New Hampshires and Production Reds. These chickens - raised without hormones, antibiotics or steroids - are laying dozens of naturally delicious, hearty, free-range eggs, which are also available for sale.

When you come to their farm, you will be treated to a fun little tour of their beautiful oasis on the edge of my favorite juniper trees, sage brush and lava rocks, with Mt. Shasta proudly standing in full view.

A few other items you will find at their little store are Western Lariat Rope Lamps, herb drying racks, iron wood stoves, arts and crafts items, as well as antiques and unique hand-made iron & wood products.





### JACKSON COUNTY, OREGON

Jackson County was created in January 1852. Carved out of the southwestern portion of Lane County and unorganized areas of Douglas and Umpqua Counties, it was named in honor of President Andrew Jackson. Its original borders ran west to the Pacific Ocean, east to Lane County, north to Umpqua and Douglas Counties, and south to California.

The first recorded gold strike in Oregon was in 1850 on Josephine Creek, near what is now Cave Junction. But the bigger strike occurred in December 1851 or January 1852, on Jackson Creek, in the Rogue River Valley.

## Discovering The State of Jefferson by Gail L. Jenner

The Applegate Trail was the southern alternative to the Oregon Trail. The trail is named for the Applegate brothers, Charles, Lindsay, and Jesse, who came along the Oregon Trail in 1843. They looked for a new route by first riding south from the central Willamette Valley into southern Oregon along what today is the Interstate 5 corridor through Douglas County.


There are a few remnants of the trail visible today. One section is at Tubb Springs State Wayside, 18 miles east of Ashland on Highway 66. Wolf Creek Tavern Inn, 20 miles north of Grants Pass off Interstate 5 is right on the trail. The trail runs roughly parallel to I-5 through much of Douglas County including the route along Canyon Creek. •

Jacksonville was first known as Table Rock City and sprang up almost overnight. It began as a makeshift mining camp and tent city, but within weeks, thousands of gold miners crowded the banks of Rich Gulch. By 1852, the small community was a town of over 1,000. Its first brick buildings were erected in 1853, and it soon became the largest city in Oregon; it was also the site of the first Chinatown in Oregon.

This rapid surge of men led to violence against the tribes who had lived in the region for generations. The Takelmas, Shasta and Rogue River tribes, as well as others, suffered terribly as the miners killed off local game and as waves of settlers encroached upon their lands. War would continue for many years, until, in 1855-56, the U.S. Army mounted a major campaign that vanquished most of the native populations.

Transportation and roads were early issues in Oregon and California. Shasta and Takelma people had traditionally used a trail that later became the Siskiyou Trail, or the Oregon-California Trail. Reportedly, it was Indian people who guided the earliest Hudson's Bay Company fur trapper Peter Skene Ogden over the summit between Oregon and California in 1827; that same trail was enlarged when Ewing Young drove a herd of cattle from California to pioneer settlements in the Willamette Valley in the 1830s. The trail would later be used by thousands of settlers who came in the wake of the California to Oregon gold rush.

In addition to the thin-crust, hand tossed, Italian style pizza, the nicely appointed lunch and dinner menus feature numerous half-pound burgers, steaks, pasta, Baja tacos, salads, fish, chicken and Chipotle BBQ. Other specialty items include Cuban chicharones and roasted red pepper hummus. If you love homemade soups, the Wayside has some award winners including their extraordinary Cajun shrimp and lobster bisque, served every Friday.

Live music is simply the finishing touch of the overall Wayside experience. Local entertainers as well as touring musicians play a wide variety of music. Terry and Denise, usually found happily cooking and serving, occasionally take a break to play and sing a few songs. What a treat!

Situated in a beautiful location with views of Mt. Shasta from the main dining room and the Eddy Mountains from the large outdoor deck and back yard, the Wayside offers indoor and outdoor dining at its best. They are open for lunch and dinner from 11am to 9pm daily, staying open later on the weekends. The bar is open from 11am until closing.



### HISTORY OF YREKA by Claudia A. East

In June of 1924 the ground breaking was underway for The Yreka Inn, and the building was slated to be ready for occupancy by October 1. The Inn was built by L. L. Weaver and his brother, W. J. Weaver ~ entrepreneurs that originally began in the grocery business. They subsequently went into general merchandise, the lumber business, etc. and eventually into the Hotel industry. Architects for this fine hotel were Tourtellotte & Hummel of Portland. This new first class hotel was situated perfectly, right on the "Great Pacific Highway" (later known as Highway 99) midway between San Francisco and Portland in Yreka. At that time all travelers heading north or south, literally drove right by this establishment! The Yreka Inn was located at 117 North Main Street and today there is a small marker that indicates where it once stood.


The Yreka Inn had 102 rooms and was an imposing concrete structure surrounded by landscaping, including towering locust trees and convenient driveways. The building was sometimes described as a "typical mountain city inn." It was reported in the History of the Sacramento Valley, California by Jesse Walton Wooldridge in 1931 that "the prices ... are reasonable and the rooms are well filled throughout the year by tourist and commercial travelers." The Inn had an adjoining restaurant and dinner house as well as a ballroom. The local Rotary clubs and other organizations were regulars with the hotel services.

It is interesting to note that originally the building was somewhat smaller, but within a year the Weavers decided they needed additional accommodations and added a 25 room wing to the south and adjoining the hotel. In a newspaper article dated August 26, 1926 in The Siskiyou News, they indicated that when the hotel was constructed the future growth of the business had not fully been taken into consideration. L. L. Weaver said that "more tourists were stopping during the height of the summer season than they could currently accommodate."

In a newspaper account from the Siskiyou Daily News on December 2, 1941 the Yreka Inn was noted as the place that held the first official meeting of the secessionists that began the movement from Northern California and Southern Oregon to form the State of Jefferson. That movement was "tabled" within a few days as a result of the bombing of Pearl Harbor and the beginning of World War II. However, many still hold the dream that someday a State of Jefferson might be formed and others carry on the spirit of independent thinking modeled by these secessionists.

Unfortunately in 1975 the hotel was razed when the property was purchased for a new local bank. The hotel was "older" then and the former Great Pacific Highway (Hwy 99) had been bypassed by the newer, faster, Interstate 5. The building needed updating and its glory days were in the past, but a great many wish the building could have been saved and restored; it would be an extraordinarily valuable asset to the city today if it were still standing! This author, for one, would be eager to stay in a classic refurbished building such as the Yreka Inn could have been. •







### What IS The Mythical State of Jefferson? By Gail Jenner



Quote: "In matters of style, swim with the current; in matters of principle, stand like a rock."

> Thomas Jefferson Lived from 1743 - 1826 3rd President of the United States & Principal Author of the Declaration of Independence

Today's State of Jefferson refers to portions of Southern Oregon and Northern California. Originally this region represented the "second half" or "northern mines" of the famous gold rush of 1849-50, but it never received the kind of historical reference that the Sierra Mother Lode did, even though it contributed as much, if not more, to the coffers of the two states. Moreover, the region was easily overlooked after the gold rush, since it continued to be less populated and more rural than the remainder of the two states.

Because the people who have settled along the northern boundary of California and the southern boundary of Oregon have always been of an independent nature, it seems fitting that this region has attempted, on numerous occasions, to create a new state, not just in name or principle, but in reality as well.

Even today, the dream lives on for this unrealized, some might even say, mystical State of Jefferson. With majestic Mt. Shasta at its heart, and the Cascades forming its backbone, the region's wild rivers and rugged peaks both isolate and, at times, insulate its residents from the more populated outside world. Ranching, mining and logging have been its traditional source of wealth, but now recreation and tourism compete as major industries. It's the people who reside here that make the greatest contribution to the character of the region called The State of Jefferson.

We welcome you to learn more about the history of our area, visit our museums, seek out the books written by local writers, and fall in love with this most amazing part of the Pacific Northwest.







# Cruisin' the Backroads! by Ralph Fain

Only a biker knows why a dog sticks his head out of a car window.

And if you ever noticed, every dog with his head in the wind is smiling, bugs and all.

As I was riding down Highway 96 towards Happy Camp I was thinking of how to explain what it feels like to have a bug kiss your face at 70 umm....55 mph. With the stinging snap of something quite large to my face, I had a vision. A rubber band pulled back to its breaking point and snapped to my lips, nose, cheeks and right between the eyes. It stings, it makes your eyes water, it makes you wonder why you didn't wear the full helmet with a face shield. Yet just as quick the sting is gone and so are the thoughts of a full helmet. Heck, if a dog can keep on smilin', so can I!

Highway 96 is a great run. You can ride for a couple hours, half day, full day or overnight and still come right back to Yreka, never traveling the same road twice unless you choose. A word of caution to those on motorcycles, watch for dirt, rocks and gravel debris that have fallen onto the roadway. You are going to encounter them all when you least expect.

The State of Jefferson Scenic Byway begins in Yreka and continues to Happy Camp. Begin at the south Yreka stoplight and head north on main street which becomes Highway 263. Travel 11.1 miles (all given mileage begins at the stoplight) and you will cross the Klamath River - with a left turn, you are on Highway 96.



## Backroads Day Tripper by Ralph Fain



At mile 27.4 you will see Quigley's Store on the left. Mile 44.2 brings you to the confluence of the Scott and Klamath Rivers. Scott River Road also meanders south here and 33 miles later you will be in Fort Jones. This road is paved with windy, narrow one lane sections. Go slow, enjoy the ride and keep it on the pavement!

Mile 46.5 brings you to Hamburg and the Rainbow Resort. Seiad Store and Café will appear at mile 55.6. The café, featured on the Travel Channel as the 3rd best place to pig out in the USA, is the spot for breakfast. Stop and take the pancake challenge! The Pacific Crest Trail crosses Highway 96 through Seiad Valley and many of the hikers stop for the pancake challenge. Also in Seiad is one of the few places along the river for fuel. There is a cardlock gas pump on the right just past the café.

Thompson Creek Lodge will be down river a way on your right. Here you will find cabins and a swimming pool. Thompson Creek is also known for a sighting of Bigfoot by a group of Chinese miners during the early gold rush in our area.

Back on Highway 96 you will arrive in Happy Camp at mile 75. A great statue of Bigfoot will greet you on the right and another of the cardlock gas stations will be on your left. It is down the bank below the highway, don't miss it. Your next chance for gas will be in Orleans 45 miles down river.

If you are ready to eat while in Happy Camp, there is a hamburger joint "Our Place" on the left, a pizza joint "The Pizza House" on the right and a small café "Frontier Café and Saloon" on the right as you drop down the hill toward the river.

The Jefferson State Scenic Byway now heads north up Indian Creek over Grayback Summit to O'Brien and Highway 199. Heading down river, you continue along the Klamath and you are now on the Bigfoot Scenic Byway. Just beyond Somes Bar you can turn east up the Salmon River Road 58 miles to Etna. This route takes you along the Salmon River on a narrow, winding, one lane paved road. Again, go slow, pay attention and keep it on the pavement. This is rugged, remote country. Make sure you have plenty of fuel and are self sufficient before heading up this road. You will be well rewarded with the country on this route. After reaching Etna you can head north to Yreka or south towards Mount Shasta.



If you continue down Highway 96 and the Klamath River, you will pass through Witchipec and Hoopa, coming out at Willow Creek on Highway 299. Head west on 299 and you will hit Highway 101 at Arcata; head north to Crescent City, take Highway 199 to Grants Pass and I-5, then south back to Yreka. Head east on 299 and you will hit Weaverville where you can take Highway 3 back to Scott Valley, Etna and Yreka. Or continue on 299 and you arrive in Redding and I-5. Backroads upon backroads - all leading back to Siskiyou County! ◆




